

Onesie Card Quickie Instructions

SUPPLIES

Stamps: Sweet Thing

Inks: Night of Navy

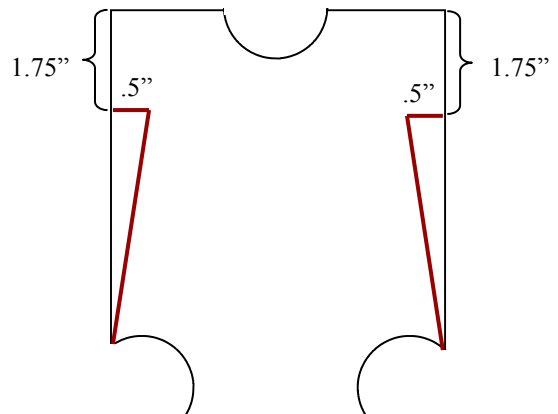
Papers: Bashful Blue and Barely Banana

Other: 1 3/8" Circle Punch, Scallop Circle Punch, Silver Eyelets, Crop-a-dial and Stamp-a-ma-jig

1. Begin by cutting a piece of Bashful Blue CS to 4.25" x 11", then score it at 5.5" and fold, creasing with a Bone Folder.

2. Over the fold, punch half of the 1 3/8" Circle Punch. Then punch three fourths of the punch on both bottom corners to form the leg holes.

3. Place a small pencil mark 1.75" down from the top on both sides. The measure .5" in and make another mark. Draw a diagonal line from the outside of each leg hole to your marks.



This is what your card should look like at this point.

4. Score a line across the bottom (between the leg holes) .5" from the bottom.

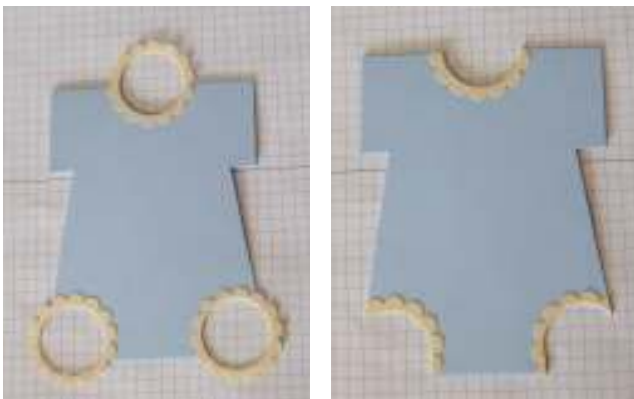
5. Punch three 1 3/8" Circles in a sheet/scrap of Barely Banana CS. Then punch the Scallop Punch as shown.



This is what you should have.



6. Apply a line of 2-Way Glue around both leg openings and the neck opening and adhere the scallops. Then trim away the excess.



7. Use the smaller hole (1/8") punch three holes between the leg openings (set the depth gauge on the Crop-a-dial to 3/8"). Then use the Crop-a-dial to place three silver eyelets into the hole for snaps.

8. Cut a 1/4" strip of Barely Banana CS. Apply 2-Way Glue to the end of one sleeve. Adhere the 1/4" strip of Barely Banana, trim and repeat on the other sleeve.
